The seven churches was to the North of Malta mainly in Asia Minor



1 Thessalonians 4:15-17

15For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep.

16For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first.



17Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord.

Caught up Strongs No 726

harpazó: to seize, catch up, snatch away

Original Word: ἀρπάζω Part of Speech: Verb

- .. speech. verb

Transliteration: harpazó

Phonetic Spelling: (har-pad'-zo)

Definition: to seize, catch up, snatch away

Usage: I seize, snatch, obtain by robbery.

10Because you have kept My command to persevere, I also will keep you from the hour of trial which shall come upon the whole world, to test those who dwell on the earth.




Mark 13:17-20

Setting the stage in Revelation 4

Revelation 4:2-3

2Immediately I was in the Spirit; and behold, a throne set in heaven, and One sat on the throne.

3 And He who sat there was like a jasper and a sardius stone in appearance; and there was a rainbow around the throne, in appearance like an emerald.

Seals one and two

First seal: The Conqueror 6:1-2

2And I looked, and behold, a white horse. He who sat on it had a bow; and a crown was given to him, and he went out conquering and to conquer.

Second Seal: Conflict 6:3-4

4Another horse, fiery red, went out. And it was granted to the one who sat on it to take peace from the earth, and that people should kill one another; and there was given to him a great sword.



Seals three and four

Third Seal: Scarcity and famine 6:5-6

5When He opened the third seal, I heard the third living creature say, "Come and see." So I looked, and behold, a black horse, and he who sat on it had a pair of scales[c] in his hand.

Fourth seal: Death 6:7-8

8So I looked, and behold, a pale horse. And the name of him who sat on it was Death, and Hades followed with him. And [f]power was given to them over a fourth of the earth, to kill with sword, with hunger, with death, and by the beasts of the earth.



Seals five and six

Fifth Seal: Plea of the martyrs 8:9-11

10And they cried with a loud voice, saying, "How long, O Lord, holy and true, until You judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?

Sixth Seal: Cosmic disturbances 8:12-17

12I looked when He opened the sixth seal, and behold, there was a great earthquake; and the sun became black as sackcloth of hair, and the [h]moon became like blood.



Interlude in Chapter 7

Witnesses from each tribe 7:1-8

4And I heard the number of those who were sealed. One hundred and forty-four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel were sealed:

Many will be saved during the tribulation 7:9-17

9After these things I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no one could number, of all nations, tribes, peoples, and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, with palm branches in their hands,



Seal Seven

Seventh Seal: unrolling of the seven trumpet judgements 8:1-6

1When He opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven for about half an hour.

The Golden Rule...

The use of "like" and "as" to describe something with no earthly reference point. This is Johns best comparison to what he actually saw.

Trumpet one and two

First Trumpet: Third of all plant life 8:7

7The first angel sounded: And hail and fire followed, mingled with blood, and they were thrown to the earth.

Second Trumpet: Third of all sea life 8:8-9

8Then the second angel sounded: And something like a great mountain burning with fire was thrown into the sea, and a third of the sea became blood.



Trumpet three and four

Third Trumpet: Third of all fresh water sources 8:10-11

11The name of the star is Wormwood. A third of the waters became wormwood, and many men died from the water, because it was made bitter.

Fourth Trumpet: Third of all celestial bodies 8:12-13

12Then the fourth angel sounded: And a third of the sun was struck, a third of the moon, and a third of the stars, so that a third of them were darkened.



Trumpet five and six

Fifth Trumpet: Locust army from the bottomless pit 9:1-12

2And he opened the bottomless pit, and smoke arose out of the pit like the smoke of a great furnace. So the sun and the air were darkened because of the smoke of the pit.

Luke 8:31

And the demons kept begging Jesus not to order them to go into the Abyss.



Trumpet five

Sixth Trumpet: Wrath pf the three angels from the Euphrates river 9:11-21

"Release the four angels who are bound at the great river Euphrates." 15So the four angels, who had been prepared for the hour and day and month and year, were released to kill a third of mankind. 16Now the number of the army of the horsemen was two hundred million; I heard the number of them.



Fifth trumpet

Sixth trumpet

- Army of locust-like beings
- From bottomless pit/ The Abyss
- Scorpion tails
- Human faces
- Long hair
- iron breastplates
- crowns of gold

- Cavelry army lead by three angels
- riders have fiery breastplates, red, blue and yellow adorned
- horses have lion heads
- breath fire
- snake-like tails

innumerable

200 million

bring pain and torment mankind for five months

bring death and kill a third of the population

The great angel and the book 10:1-10

11 saw still another mighty angel coming down from heaven, clothed with a cloud. And a rainbow was on his head, his face was like the sun, and his feet like pillars of fire. 2He had a little book open in his hand. And he set his right foot on the sea and his left foot on the land,

The two witnesses killed and resurrected 11:1-14

3And I will give power to my two witnesses, and they will prophesy one thousand two hundred and sixty days, clothed in sackcloth."




Trumpet Seven

Seventh Trumpet: The Kingdom revealed and proclaimed 11:15-19

15Then the seventh angel sounded: And there were loud voices in heaven, saying, "The [f]kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ, and He shall reign forever and ever!"

Plagues one and two

first plague: foul sores and everyone that had the mark

2So the first went and poured out his bowl upon the earth, and a foul and loathsome sore came upon the men who had the mark of the beast and those who worshiped his image.

Second plague: sea turns to coagulated blood, kills all marine life

3Then the second angel poured out his bowl on the sea, and it became blood as of a dead man; and every living creature in the sea died.



Plague three

Third plague: fresh water turns to blood accompanied by a song of praise from the angel

6For they have shed the blood of saints and prophets,
And You have given them blood to drink.
For it is their just due."



Plagues four and five

Fourth plague: great heat and fire from the sun

8Then the fourth angel poured out his bowl on the sun, and power was given to him to scorch men with fire.

Fifth plague: pain and darkness on the kingdom of the beast

10Then the fifth angel poured out his bowl on the throne of the beast, and his kingdom became full of darkness; and they gnawed their tongues because of the pain.



Plague six

sixth plague: Euphrates dries up. Three evil spirits start to gather all nations together for the coming battle at Armageddon.

14For they are spirits of demons, performing signs, which go out to the kings [g]of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty. 16And they gathered them together to the place called in Hebrew, Armageddon.

Plague seven

Seventh plague: A great earthquake, hail and storms

18And there were noises and thunderings and lightnings; and there was a great earthquake, such a mighty and great earthquake as had not occurred since men were on the earth.

Three Angelic declrations

Declaration of the first angel 18:1-3 announces the fall of Babylon

2And he cried [a]mightily with a loud voice, saying, "Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen, and has become a dwelling place of demons, a prison for every foul spirit, and a cage for every unclean and hated bird!

Declaration of the second angel 18:4-8 warns the rightious to flee the city

4And I heard another voice from heaven saying, "Come out of her, my people, lest you share in her sins, and lest you receive of her plagues.

Declaration of the third angel 18:21-24 declars the finality of her fall

21Then a mighty angel took up a stone like a great millstone and threw it into the sea, saying, "Thus with violence the great city Babylon shall be thrown down, and shall not be found anymore.



The two reactions to Babylon's fall

The world mourns over her fall 18:9-20

9"The kings of the earth who committed fornication and lived luxuriously with her will weep and lament for her, when they see the smoke of her burning,

Heaven exalts over her fall 19:1-9

2For true and righteous are His judgments, because He has judged the great harlot who corrupted the earth with her fornication; and He has avenged on her the blood of His servants shed by her."




